## **New Direction for Lexington Chrysalis**

Hello. My name is Michael Deaton. I attended Lake Cumberland Area Chrysalis Flight #3 and sat at the table of EGGGS for God (Eight Great Guys Going Strong for God). I am the new Chrysalis Coordinator for the Lexington Emmaus Community. I have a vast amount of Chrysalis experience in almost every role available throughout the weekend experience. I have been clergy and laity, youth and adult, and music coordinator multiple times. I have worked about 19 Lake Cumberland Chrysalis Retreats and 1 here in Lexington. I have a passion for Chrysalis and the impact that it can have on the lives of young believers and I now have a chance to take that passion and attempt to bring Lexington's Chrysalis community up a notch.

My first goal is to form a Chrysalis sub-committee that will partner with me to help us discern and move in the direction that God wants this community to move. There are some areas that need to be tinkered with and some areas that may need a change, but all of this will come with time, prayer, and careful planning with consideration to the traditions of Lexington's Emmaus/Chrysalis community.

The second goal is to revitalize this area of the Emmaus Community. There seems to have been a constant struggle over the years to maintain and move the Chrysalis forward. I admit that the reason for my continued attachment to Lake Cumberland is their commitment to the Chrysalis. Several years ago, I tried to send some youth on a Lexington Chrysalis, or get information about the Lexington Chrysalis only to be told that they weren't sure if they were even going to have a Chrysalis anymore, because it was slowly dying out. This was said to me by an official rep of the community. This will never happen under my watch. We are called into a vibrant life of service and worship to our Lord, Jesus. With a calling like this, how can we even become a dying community?

The final goal I have for the coming year is to not only revitalize the Chrysalis movement within the Lexington Emmaus Community, but to expand it. The Chrysalis flight last February was the largest flight in Lexington history, or at least that is what I was told. Chrysalis is on the rise in Lexington. We need to do more than one flight a year. I am not sure if another flight is needed at this time, or if maybe we do a follow-up retreat a few months after the flight. I have a ton of ideas for this area and once I have the right people in place, we will begin to move on these ideas.

I know that right now I am extremely pumped up about the opportunity to help make the Lexington Chrysalis even more awesome than it already is. I also know that things get more difficult once the rubber meets the road, so I covet your prayers in this coming year, that the direction that we move is in fact the direction God is leading us. Pray for the upcoming flight and walks that God will continue to breathe new life into our community.

 $30 + 5-8 = \$6.00 + \$3.50 = \$9.50$   
 $30 + 9-10 = \$6.00 + \$4.00 = \$10.00$
