CHILD CARE

OUR CALL AS A COMMUNITY TO SPONSORSHIP

THANK YOU FROM ERICA MICHELLE WRIGHT

Dear Friends,

I am writing this letter to thank each one of you for your extensive financial and prayerful support as I journeyed to God's Holy Land just a few weeks ago. What an amazing experience, and I have each of you to thank for making it possible!

I'm sure that many of you kept up with the news and the events that unfortunately unfolded in the two weeks that I was in Israel. I assure you that being there at the initiation of this severe conflict was not only frightening but also led to an extreme examination of my faith.

The Lord challenged me to stay in Israel though multiple times I was faced with unimaginable fear and doubt. It's amazing to think how the Lord keeps us from danger each day but sometimes chooses to unmistakably show us His protection and his faithfulness that remains in our time of deepest need.

The entire process of this trip was life changing. Not only were my two weeks in Israel unforgettable, but I will also never forget the months that led up to this trip. These were months in which the Lord showed me His heart for Israel, His faithfulness to provide and His desire for me to go and share the love of Yeshua the Messiah to His people. It was truly amazing to serve on the beaches and street and in retirement homes and ministry centers.

Doing the smallest things or having even a brief conversation with someone was an amazing opportunity and a blessing. Even a simple prayer walk was an honor and a privilege. I met amazing servants who have chosen to serve in Israel and was inspired by their commitment to the Jewish people.

I hope to one day be able to sit down with each one of you and tell you all the details of this awesome experience. Until then I hope that each of you know the tremendous gratitude that I have for your love and support. Thank you again for your prayers and I beg of you to continue to pray for the people of Israel as they face this time of intense turmoil.

Because of may not have the opportunity to personally share my experience with each of you I will leave you with my favorite moment of this trip, which is a common question that I've been asked lately.

As many of you know, I spent my 20th birthday in Israel. At this point in the trip, we found ourselves in Nazareth, an initially unexpected stop but part of our "Katyusha-revised" itinerary. At about 11:30 PM, while thinking that Nazareth was one of the safest cities to reside in, a katyusha rocket hit about 15km from our hotel. As a team, we held an emergence meeting in our hotel, where we were filled in regarding the current developments.

After discussing what had just happened, we fell on our faces before the Lord as a team. We wept for our trip, for our fear, for our families at home, and for the faith that we were desperate for. As we sat in the hometown of our Savior, we acknowledged our weakness and sought His protection and strength. What a beautiful picture it was of a community of believers, all from different walks of life, coming together in the Holy Land of our faith, desperate for the Lord our God.

May his love and peace be with you.
