SPONSORSHIP CHECKLIST

With our Fall Walks approaching, it is time to turn our thoughts toward passing our experience forward and sponsoring a pilgrim. Below is a sponsorship checklist that Patricia and Fred Walsh gave at the September Gathering.

1. REMEMBER, WALK TO EMMAUS IS A CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP PROGRAM. Consider people currently in church leadership, or who have been there and are now resting, or who have future potential as leader. The Walk is not an opportunity to *convert* someone to Christianity, it is not a cure for illnesses or depression, nor is it a *cure* for divorce or grief. The purpose is to develop Christian leaders to fulfill the great commission.
2. PRAY FOR GUIDANCE FROM THE HOLY SPIRIT IN YOUR SPONSORING. I am sure you see that prayer is essential. Listen, don't just talk.
3. ASK FOR SPECIFIC NAMES. You will know when a name comes to you. Once you have a name write it down.
4. PRAY FOR THOSE NAMED, ESPECIALLY IF THE NAMES COME FROM OTHER SOURCES. Once again, I cannot stress prayer. You need to be at peace when you pray for this person. You will be changing their life forever! Be sure they are spiritually ready for that.
5. SPEAK TO THE POTENTIAL PILGRIM BRIEFLY DESCRIBING THE WALK. You can tell them there are 15 talks, 5 by clergy and 10 by laity; communion daily, great meals, etc. You can tell them they will be seated at a table with a group of women for the entire weekend. You can tell them they will be discussing each talk, but they do not HAVE to talk. You can tell them there is chapel time to talk with God personally each day. Just remember, your Walk was unique to you; it was not a model for other pilgrims on other walks. I let them know that I cannot tell them what God will do for them. I only can tell them what God did, and is still doing, for me.
6. DOES HE/SHE HAVE ANY QUESTIONS? If so, answer them briefly and truthfully. There is nothing to hide and there are no secrets. I told one pilgrim there was a candlelight service. They pictured Christmas Eve, and boy were they blown away. Later they said, "That was no ordinary candlelight service!"
7. ASK HIM/HER TO PRAY ABOUT GOING ON A SPECIFIC DATE. Once again, prayer is significant. Then, agree to reconnect by a specific time.
8. CHECK BACK WITH THE POTENTIAL CANDIDATE –YES OR NO? As the sponsor, take the initiative to get an answer.
9. IF YES, COMPLETE THE CANDIDATE APPLICATION AND THE SPONSOR'S FORM; SUBMIT TO THE REGISTRAR AT LEAST 3 WEEKS PRIOR TO START OF WALK. Please, on behalf of the registrar FULLY COMPLETE THE CANDIDATE APPLICATION! Leave no blank unfilled. The sooner the application is in, the better. The payment also needs to be made in a timely manner. However, do not let the cost deter you. Some pilgrims pay for themselves, some churches have scholarships, and some small groups help the sponsor with finances. There are also scholarships through Lexington Emmaus. If the pilgrim is married, and the spouse is not attending, please make it clear as to why. It may be they attended earlier, or they intend to go the next time due to work issues. Please remember this is a life changing experience and it may cause friction in a marriage if the spouse is not involved.
10. GET 10 AGAPE LETTERS FROM FAMILY AND FRIENDS. You should ask 20 people for letters to expect 10 in return. Have older children get you addresses of their grandparents, aunts, and uncles. Ask them also to write an agape letter. Young children can do a drawing for mommy or daddy. Now, I once sponsored a couple with no local family. I said I needed a list of "emergency contacts". It was a sneaky way to be sure I had some important names and numbers.

11. BRING PILGRIM TO THURSDAY NIGHT SEND OFF; ARRIVE NOT LATER THAN 7:00 P.M. Come earlier if the pilgrim needs to eat and missed supper at home. When you pick them up be sure to have them leave their phone, watch, iPod, etc. at home. I tell them they will be fasting from technology for 72 hours.

12. STAY FOR SPONSOR'S HOUR TO: PRAY WHILE HOLDING THE CROSS THE PILGRIM WILL RECEIVE AND TO PUT AGAPE LETTERS IN BOX. I know some have a long trip home. But sponsor's hour is the critical beginning for your pilgrim. Imagine if no one prayed for you before your walk!

13. BE IN CONSTANT PRAYER THROUGHOUT THE 72 HOURS. I know I sound like a broken record. Pray, pray, pray, then pray some more. You may sign for a period on the Prayer Vigil; that is well and good; but as the sponsor, you are on 72-hour duty for your pilgrim. It can be while you're in the car, in line at the store, at Starbucks, getting a hair cut, or in the shower.

14. CARE FOR THE FAMILY LEFT BEHIND DURING THE WEEKEND. Be sure the family left at home is doing fine and can handle the pilgrim being away all weekend. You may need to help with small children, picking up school age children, or cooking a meal. This is all part of sponsorship support.

15. COME FOR CANDLELIGHT ON SATURDAY NIGHT. Here we are back at candlelight. Imagine the feeling you had when you saw your sponsor smiling back at you through tears as they walked past you as you sang a love song.

16. COME TO CLOSING ON SUNDAY AFTERNOON. That seems simple enough, but there have been pilgrims with no one to take them home. This is a great time to debrief and help them reconnect with reality. You can take them out for dinner following as well.

17. BRING YOUR PILGRIM TO THE NEXT GATHERING (AND 2 OR 3 MORE). This is important! Bringing the pilgrim shows (a) you still have an interest, (b) the route to the Gathering, and (c) it establishes a habit pattern of coming to the Gathering.

18. CONNECT YOUR PILGRIM TO A REUNION GROUP. The first weekend we attended our new church in Nicholasville we were visited by a couple. They greeted me with DeColores when I answered the door because they saw my DeColores bumper sticker. I asked if there was a small group. They said no, so we started one. Be sure your pilgrim is connected in a small group someplace.

Sponsorship is a big task. I suggest that you either SPONSOR OR WORK, but NOT BOTH for all the reasons above. However, if you are going to work and sponsor, please give a written prayer to someone who will be at SPONSOR'S HOUR and CANDLELIGHT who then can pray specifically for your pilgrim. In fact, I think sponsorship is such an important element of Walk to Emmaus that the whole time I was the community lay director, I neither sponsored a candidate nor worked a Walk because I focused on Sponsor's Hour, Candlelight and Closing.

I feel that sponsoring is a part of my fourth days. It is an honor to bring my Christian friends to a place where they may deepen their relationship with Christ. De Colores and happy sponsoring.

The loan to checking was to cover Walk expenses that the Community did not have the money to pay in 2008. This was the reason Walk fees were increased this year. Other expenses, such as the Cook Book and the Carl Hurley evening, supported projects that raised significant amounts of money for the Matching Fund.
