
**But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint.**

## BOOK REVIEW by Patricia Walsh

### Six Qualities of Women of Character; Life Changing Examples of Godly Women

I was given this book by my sweet daughter for Mother's Day 1996 and reread it after this last move to the new house. My small group decided to read it, discuss it, and attempt to emulate each characteristic. It has been life-changing for us all. The author chose a quote from Psalms to open the book, "As for the saints who are in the land, they are the glorious ones in whom is all my delight." (Psalm 16:3)

The title itself is ominous but so are the six qualities; brokenness, belief, surrender, obedience, devotion and service. The author takes you on a journey through each of the women's lives displaying amazing examples of each characteristic. Some of the women are familiar from reading the Scriptures such as Mary of Bethany and her alabaster jar broken for Jesus and some were unknown.

One unknown to me was. Her parents secretly taught her scriptures. By the time she was eleven years old she spoke and read nine languages, one of which was English. Her life was spent in brokenness and famine as an orphan. In a quote from her journal she wrote, "There was nothing but to be amalgamated into Nothingness... The Holy Spirit made it clear to me from the Word of God, that the salvation that God gives through Christ is present, and not something future. I believed it, I received it, and I was filled with joy."

Biblical references to apply the Truth and further understand the lives of each woman are carefully placed throughout. Each chapter has one woman from the Bible and others to emphasize the characteristic. As you work your way through from brokenness to surrender and finally to service it is almost like going through the Walk from priorities through grace to fourth day.

This book's focus is on women but could be read by anyone. I took away a new way to dedicate my days to Christ every morning with whatever He has given me for that day and a renewed sense of gratitude.



## “I can’t do that! I’m not a leader!”

Has someone recently asked you to serve in a particular role for your church or Emmaus Community? For most of us our first instinct is to think “I can’t do that!” or “I don’t have the time!” Or “I am already doing my part.”

We all need to prayerfully consider opportunities to serve that come our way. We may need to prioritize our current activities and evaluate if that is where the Lord can best use our skills. As humans, we may not have the time or skills to do something on our own, but the good thing is God does not ask us to do it alone. We are on His Team and He provides the time, energy, and skills needed to get the job done. With the Holy Spirit, all things are possible.

Spiritual growth comes from taking chances and stretching our comfort zone. With prayer and council from the scriptures, we can make decisions to serve that will benefit both you and those around you. Moses did not want to take on the role of leader of the Israelites. Paul never pictured himself as an apostle for Christ, spreading the Good News. God opened their hearts and provided them what they needed to do His work.

Look into your heart and ask if you are limiting yourself of opportunities to serve because you won’t trust God to support you in this endeavor. Prayerfully consider each request and God will help clarify if this is your time to step out and serve. The Lord will bless you more than you can imagine!

## **HELP IS NEEDED! IS THE LORD CALLING YOU?**

### **Child Care Coordinator**

The Lexington Emmaus Board of Directors is looking for just the right person to take on the task of arranging child care for our gatherings. In the past year we have had difficulty arranging to have childcare provided at every gathering. Some churches just are not able to supply the childcare even though we will pay them. We have to use child care providers that have been background checked, at least 21 years old and will follow our community policies and those of the UPPER ROOM for Emmaus Communities. If the Lord is speaking to you to fill this need, pray, talk to a board member and take action.

### **Nominations for New Board Members**

The governing body for our community is the Board of Directors. We have a currently have a 17 member board to lead us into the future. Community members are nominated and elected by secret ballot by the community. The members who are elected serve on the board for a three year term. At the end of that term, new board members are elected for a new three year term. If a board member is appointed to fill out a term that is vacated then they serve the remainder of that term but must be elected to continue on the board.

### **Prayer Vigil**

Each and every Emmaus Walk is covered by a 72 Hour Prayer Vigil. Community members are asked to sign-up at the gathering or by contacting Jeanie Heaberlin or Paul Purcell.

### **Agape**

Please remember while preparing tokens of Agape for our pilgrims and caterpillars, that it is the philosophy of the Upper Room Emmaus that all Agape be given anonymously. We still can make and preserve our Agape tradition by attaching a label such as those below if you choose or with no label. Each set of Agape needs to include 60-70 pieces unless otherwise specified and all the same item. This includes the team and the pilgrims. Remember no individual gifts will be distributed.


## More Information on Gatherings
